## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee incorporated on the 10 June 2009 and has no share capital. The company was established under Memorandom of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1

#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The company's objects are to promote the benefit of the residents of Strathglass and District by associating the local and other statutory authorities, voluntary organisations and residents in a common effort to relieve poverty, advance education, further health and in the interests of social welfare promote the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupation so that the conditions of life of the aforementioned residents may be improved.

The charity was established in June 2009 to enable the local community to take on the running and management of the village hall in Cannich.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Summary of the achievements during the period:

- Funding of £3,000 was secured from the Highland Council Ward Discretionary Fund to cover legal fees
- Further funding of £250 was secured from Best Western to promote arts events
- The completion of the feasibility study outlining the community's preferred development option for the hall.
- Following the issuing of a tender brief, an architect was appointed in May 2011 to take forward the project to refurbish the hall.
- During the course of the year, the hall held two fund raising events.
- The charity established a website which will be one of the main ways of keeping the community informed of events, bookings, classes, fund raisers and other hall related news.
- A formal agreement by Scottish and Southern Energy to transfer 205.77 square meters of land immediately bordering the footprint of the hall to its southern elevation. This will enable the eventual building of an extension.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

Expenditure exceeded income from funding by £5,032 (2010 surplus £11,599). Unrestricted reserves as at 30 June 2011 were £3,567 (2010 - £11,599) and restricted reserves were £3,000 (2010 - £10,000).

#### PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Summary of plans for the future:

- Finalise plans and costs and secure external funding for the refurbishment project.
- Local fundraising events and activities.
- A tie-up with the Promoters Arts Network to enable the hall to host art events
- To organise and host traditional music events.
- Formal tendering of works relating to the refurbishment with a view to beginning construction work.

#### RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees (who are also the directors of Strathglass & Affric Community Company Ltd for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- · select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- · observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- · make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- · prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

#### Fund accounting

Funds held by charity are either

Unrestricted general funds -

General funds - General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds - Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the directors for particular purposes.

Restricted funds - these are funds which can be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular purposes.

#### **Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants that provide funding of a general nature, are recognised where there is an entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.
- Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.
- Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract or where entitlement to grant funding is subject to specific performance conditions. Grant income included in this category provides funding to support programme activities and is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2011

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of expenditure to which it relates.

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those associated with meeting constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of resources. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on a appropriate basis e.g. floor areas, per capita or estimated usage as set out in the notes.

#### Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:
